Loop 101 (Pima Freeway) General-Purpose Lanes Project Overview

In 2014, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) will construct 11 miles of additional travel lanes for all motorists on the Loop 101 (Pima Freeway) from the Loop 202 (Red Mountain Freeway)/Loop 101 system interchange to Shea Boulevard.

WHAT TO EXPECT

At the completion of this project, motorists can look forward to:

- ▶ An additional travel lane both north and southbound
- ▶ Two additional travel lanes from the northbound Loop 101/Loop 202 system interchange entrance ramp to McDowell Road
- ▶ A north and southbound auxiliary lane, allowing motorists to merge or continue to the next exit, between Indian Bend Road and McDonald Drive
- ▶ A quieter and smoother driving experience with the use of rubberized asphalt on the widened roadway surface

DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

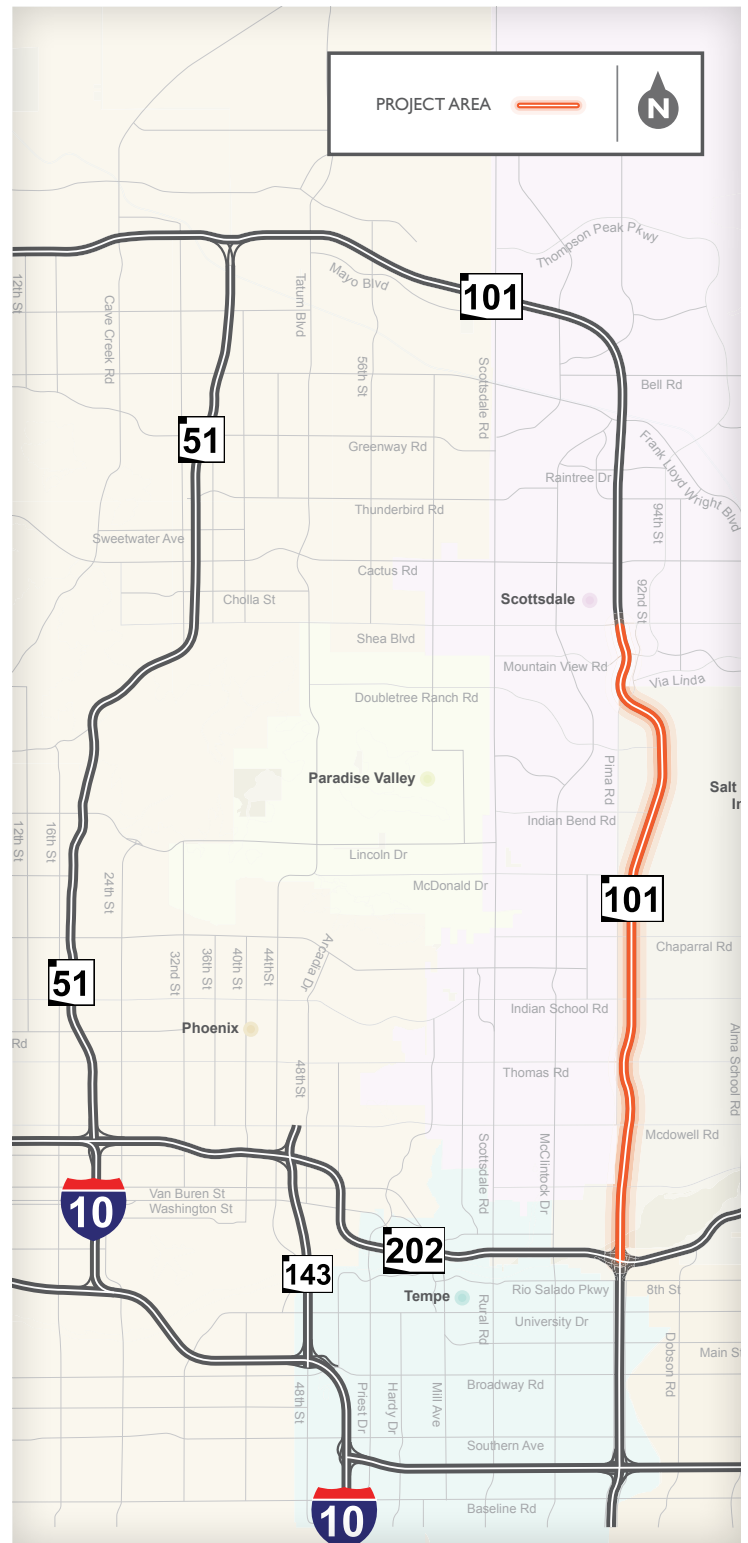
- ▶ ADOT anticipates that the freeway design process will be completed in 2013. Construction is currently scheduled to begin 2014.
